### **Introduction**

The changes to the original WORDWEB include:

- **Print Literate Program** option in the **File** menu that adds cross-references to code modules and some other minor things.
- **Find Definition** and **Find Reference** options in the **Edit** menu to find the definition or reference of the module name the cursor is sitting on.
- **Insert Module Sequence** option that uses a sequence number to provide module numbers if you want them.
- **Insert Module Index** and **Update Module Index** that insert and update indexes appropriately (this creates and uses a file with a .MDX index).
- A **header** style that I do not use.

### **Manual**

Read the WORDWEB.DOC file provided by Lee for a simple introduction and *NOTE THE COMMENT ABOUT BUGS*. Be sure to set up at least one printer because the macros repaginate the document and will fail if there are no printers.
